**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Landis, you're recognized to open on your motion.

**SENATOR LANDIS:** Thank you. I'm going to withdraw this motion very briefly. My impression is, as I listen to this, that there's a number of people who have some qualms about the bill and no way out at the moment. Senator Engel has said he's got faith in the system, but he hasn't said quite yet I'm prepared to work on this bill and see if I can work it out. And I, frankly, got to...I want to know if that's going to happen, or if we're going to hear that kind of a conversation or not, or whether in fact we're going to try to move the bill as if we were done with it. It seems to me parties should be able to work this out, if parties were committed to working this out. And I have yet to hear parties say, look, I'll work in good faith to work this out and I will take effort and energy to make that happen. I actually heard Senator Chambers say, look, if Pat Engel asked me to do that, I'd do that, but I haven't heard that request, and it makes me say that this bill is not ready to vote on if we can't do that kind of a conversation, and have that kind of a conversation, if there isn't commitment to working the bill out. So that's why I filed this motion. It seems to me we should be past this point or we should be designing a system to make this thing work. And the conversation isn't going that way right now, which is why I put this motion up here, to see if I'm the only one who thinks people ought to be working this bill out rather than just butting heads at this point and hoping there's going to be 25 votes. I told Curt Bromm, because he had his light on, and I muscled my way ahead of his light by making this motion, I'd yield my time to him.

**SENATOR BROMM:** Thank you, Senator Landis. And I did not know until just real recent past here that we had a problem like this on the bill, or I hope that I would have been working on it, and I would want to do that. Let me...let me say this, and when John, Senator Hilgert, when you came up and spoke to be a couple minutes this afternoon and I didn't have a full understanding of what your concerns were, please understand that in the 16 years I was associated with a county attorney's office, our standard procedure was DUI, you run a driving record check, comes up
