SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Crosby, members of the Legislature. Let's put this back on a little bit smaller scale. We're talking millions and millions of dollars. Let's go...I was sitting here thinking about in the retail business we've been more or less mandated to go to digital scales and printout materials to be in compliance with federal regulations and state regulations with the Division of Weights and Measures. We're talking maybe a couple thousand dollars for a new scale. Smaller scale, easier to read, they have information on all the tags that the consumers want, but that's a cost. You can't use the old spring scales anymore where you could put your thumb on and get a few (laugh) extra cents. That's a thing of the past. So you have to...you have to use the new scale. We bought new scales; we depreciate them, it's a business expense to depreciate those scales. I would image that the communication business is the same way, that's an expense. Another mandate that we have to comply with is the electronic benefit transfer. There are no longer going to be food stamps, so if you want to be a full service grocery store you have to comply and get...to handle the EBT cards, that's another expense in some cases, other cases it won't be. But those are mandates that most everyone in the retail business actually take for granted. I mean, here it is, all right, we're going to have to comply if we're going to do that. So, I understand the situation. These...these are huge amounts of money. And looking back on the budget, what it cost the state run television station to comply, my goodness, that's an astronomical amount of money. But this is the kind of business that these people wish to be in. Every business have their mandates. The retail people are
