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relate to the state trying to favor certain specified private interest groups that are wanting to make a profit. Now at one time I thought my friend, "Mr. Wizard", was just against the gravy train of tax credits. But I find out that he was really against it because his constituents were not allowed to book a Pullman car on the gravy train. But now that they're going to get a car added to the gravy train, well now it's okay. Gravy is pretty good; it's got flour in it, flour comes from wheat, wheat comes from the ground, farmers prepare the ground, make the wheat, grind it into flour, people buy the flour, put it into these other ingredients and make gravy, so it's really helping the farmers. So the gravy train is good. As Gekko said in that movie, 'greed is good'. He should have said greed is America. Now, on this specific proposal that's before us today, I cannot support it. I'm not being consistent just for the purpose of saying that I'm consistent. But I don't think that the state should be taking other people's money on this large a scale and giving it to others. They said that Huey Long, or Earl Long, whichever one of those cutthroats it was, said, don't tax you, don't tax me, tax that fella behind the tree. If taxes must be paid and there are three people in the pool...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...of taxpayers, if one of them does not pay tax, the other two have to make up for what that third one is not paying. And when that third one is going to derive benefits, then there is a skewing of the situation which should not be allowed to exist. Now if this were some small entrepreneurs who, through no fault of their own, are faced with a serious problem, I'm in a position where I can bend on that kind of a situation, but, on this one, I'm afraid that I cannot support this bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Madam President, members, sometimes you have to look at a situation from a realistic point of view. Now I'm not sure how I'm going to vote on this bill actually, but it's going to depend on perhaps an answer that Senator Kristensen is going to give me in a few minutes. If you're mandated to do something, if you're told to do something, that's the difference
