SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...pressure, turned more money over for A bills to the Legislature. But I think in considering matters like this you're still going to have to make a lot of choices. If you want to restore all of the property tax relief, you only have \$5 million for A bills, and obviously there's not room for a bill like this, given all the other things out there that I would easily predict you would prefer over this in terms of spending \$5 million. If you want to go to \$14 million, there may be room for something like this, if this is what you want to spend it for. But I would suggest that even this, at a \$14 million...as part of a \$14 million package, probably should be pared down to put it in the kind of perspective that I think most of you would want...would want it in. So all I'm saying is you have to consider this like an A bill, it's a revenue reduction bill, it's part of the money that...

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...that is or is not available for new things this year. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Wickersham, followed by Chambers and Brashear.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Madam President, I want to complete the remarks that I started last time and got a little too long-winded to finish in five minutes. If you remember, I was talking about a decision-making model, one where you ask, well what is it that you want, get that firmly in hour mind; ask why do you want it? I think I'd gotten through most of the topics in that regard. The whys didn't seem very convincing to me, maybe they've been more convincing to you. But then the third part of the discussion that I have with myself is, should we do it, should I do it, should I vote for that? Even if I had a compelling "why", I should do it in this instance, the final answer to the question of should I do it has to be no for some of the reasons that we've heard discussed.
