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I have no opposition to, I am comfortable with that, but this is to accrue specifically to those farmers and ranchers, in many cases, to make adjustments, to make a transition into new and other activities that they may persuade the worthiness of...to those that grant these monies to, so that they can perhaps take off on another part of life that would encourage them to stay where they're at, stay locally...locally based, and stay in rural Nebraska but still have a business or an enterprise of their own, and this would be the intent of the bill. There is a significant amount of money in the bill at this time. If you'll notice, it says that it's the intent of the Legislature to appropriate next year so, actually, if the bill passes we'll have to make an appropriation next year, starting July 1st of 2001. There's a million dollars in for the entrepreneurial part of it. There's \$875,000 each year for "microenterprise" which is already up and going. That's the...via LB 327 that we passed a few years ago. The \$875,000 first of all for the "microenterprise" is what is considered by the "microenterprise" folks a very successful program. At this point it's for small businesses also, incubation, if you will. But that would be...(inaudible) appropriating \$250,000 here right now for that. Eight hundred and seventy-five is the figure considered necessary to take that statewide. Now the other one is more concerned with the bill itself. The farmers...the farmers and ranchers opportunity bill would be to have a million dollars and those are for grants up to \$75,000 for business plans, for market development, for business assessment, all those kinds of things that are stated actually in Section 4 of the bill. Those are the things that are the goals of the bill and the value-added would be included in that. But, once again, the intent is for these values to occur, these rewards to occur for those that are on the farm and ranch and not a business that's being moved into it, but to grow your own, if you will, at home. We've had some requests in Appropriations Committee for funding for some of these across the state that are doing very well promoting themselves and encouraging development. It might have to do with truck gardening, it might have to do with small businesses, making of flours or whatever across the state. Those kind of activities would occur, would be very appropriate to be eligible for these grants to expand or grow that business or to start one. One of the things that came out of our farm structure study bill was the fact that it appears there's going
