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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there some way you could craft, not you individually because you may not agree with that idea, that language could be crafted where if one of these operations which had received this money is profitable then it should pay the money back; if it is not profitable then the loan can be forgiven? Then it's not just an out-and-out giveaway program from the ground up regardless of how profitable the operation may turn out to be.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I would say that's possible to draft that with diligence, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's not necessarily what I'm saying I would do, but there are a lot of questions I have about this program and you'll see that I was one of the people who voted it out of committee, so I have mixed emotions on the bill now. But I want to ask you a question because there is also an element in the committee amendment that deals with this micro...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Enterprises?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...loan, whatever it's called. Under this giveaway program there has to be a match. It can be either in other money, in-kind service, or a combination.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it only has to be 25 percent. Under the micro program, which gives a far smaller amount, the match has to be 50 percent. Why should there have to be...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...twice as high a match under the micro program as under this giveaway program?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm not sure why that was done there. If you noticed it, we...it was one to one and this is lowering it to half to make it probably more feasible for smaller ones to get started. But it is still different from 25 to 50, I'll agree.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And these are just some questions and I will
