SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I have but one comment. When this bill was voted on, on General File and again on Select, it had over 30 votes. I would simply ask those who supported it to support it now. Nothing has changed with reference to the bill and what it does from that day to this. That's all that I have, and I will ask for a call of the house.
