SENATOR JENSEN: So, if they met these 15 items that were on here, they could then be licensed, is that correct?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR THOMPSON: I'm just going to check...where's our...

SENATOR JENSEN: Then...then...

SENATOR THOMPSON: I'd just like to check with legal counsel for just...to double check that, if you would give me a second.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR THOMPSON: I have my light on, so if we don't get done, I just want to double check that.

SENATOR JENSEN: All right. And then there are other vehicles, there's a Dahatsu (phonetic), I think that's the way you pronounce it, which is again a smaller vehicle. You see them in other communities, both on the street and then in confined areas. I think even the University of Nebraska have some over here on their campus. I wonder if those vehicles would be allowed to be used?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay, I'm getting the answer to your first question.

SENATOR JENSEN: (Laugh) Oh, okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, if you could go ahead.

And in many respects these vehicles are certainly safer than...for a young person to go back and forth to school than would a motorcycle or some of those things that we do see them using.
