potential within our statutes to have this vehicle licensed on the road. So if he could go to a certain county that says it's okay, which some counties have, can license the vehicle and go forward and have to wait to be challenged. That to me did not seem like a reasonable way to approach this issue. I don't think someone should have to challenge the law, go to court, and prove that they can drive this vehicle on Nebraska roads. But that may happen and that may be the way this goes. The same bill is in the Iowa Legislature; it passed unanimously in the House in similar fashion; it's law in many states. I do think it's appropriate for us as a body to go forward with this. I didn't anticipate this problem, because it did have a hearing, it was before an interim study last fall. Several people in the Legislature have actually driven the vehicle. It isn't something that would be driven on a major highway. I am disappointed but I do...will bring it back next year. I don't want to take the bodies time on this, if we're running into snags such as we appear to be. And I do believe that, with the proper information being supplied to people, you can support this. This is a vehicle, as I mentioned, that meets the standards of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. We let mopeds on the streets, we let motorcycles on the streets, this car has more protection than either of those. And I will urge the person who brought it to me, if they want to go ahead and go to court and challenge those county attorneys that have told them this is a legal vehicle, and the city prosecutor who told them that they felt this was legal, they may be able to challenge it before the session. But I do believe that it would have been a better way today to have amended the law that would have allowed these vehicles to be sold in our state and licensed. They may already be able to, this was a clarification. I'd also like to thank the Department of Motor Vehicles for helping develop this legislation. And if they aren't able to resolve this through a court case, I'll be back with it next session. And with that, I would withdraw the amendment.
