SENATOR BROMM: Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...manufacturer or distributor. So do we need to keep that part of subdivision (b)?

SENATOR BROMM: And...and, Senator Chambers, in our discussion a little while ago I misunderstood what you were striking. And I think your proposal, as I reread it, looks fine the way it's proposed. So we leave the sale...the intent is that the dealer can...the manufacturer can hold this for a period of time after they repossess it or take it over from somebody that goes under and during that time that it is for sale, and so I think it's fine to strike the reasonable price, reasonable terms language and leave the rest of it there. So I think the amendment is all right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Then I'm going to read what the amendment will do, because I'm not going to have to redo it or substitute. On page 12 in lines 22 and 23, these words would be stricken "at a reasonable price and on reasonable terms and conditions". It would then leave standing the words "the franchise is for sale by the manufacturer or distributor". And I did not want us to put words into the statute that appears that we're trying, through statute, to write the terms of a contract. This way you have a willing seller, a willing buyer or some willing potential buyers. And if anybody who is interested in purchasing this franchise believes, or even if the person is not interested in purchasing it, believes that the manufacturer or distributor is setting a price and conditions which have no purpose, other than to circumvent the law, then a challenge could be made to that because all of these other conditions have to be met before a manufacturer or a distributor can hold one of these franchises. So you start with the premise that it's illegal for a manufacturer or distributor to hold one of these franchises. Then you add language which creates an exception. One of the parts of that exception is that the franchise must be for sale. In order for something to really be deemed for sale, the price would have to be within some kind of reasonable relationship to what the price would be if you could establish what the market is for the buying and selling of such an operation. So it is unnecessary to have this language which
