SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, would you yield for a question?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, when we talk about this vehicle being delivered in Nebraska, that does not cover a person who purchases the car in another state and drives it into Nebraska himself or herself? It's not intended to do that, to cover that.

SENATOR BROMM: That's correct, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How do we know that's the case? And I'm not trying to be facetious. Is it...is it your...

SENATOR BROMM: It's...it would...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you feel that it's clear from the language that this refers to a third party, not the seller, nor the buyer, but a third party moving that vehicle from the place where it was purchased and bringing it to the purchaser in Nebraska?

SENATOR BROMM: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, and that's the only circumstance under which this provision would come into play.

SENATOR BROMM: Because, if I could elaborate just a bit,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: ...because I think if the purchaser goes to that other state, makes the purchase, brings the car back, there is
