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activity here. Would that seem unreasonable to you?

SENATOR BROMM: That...that would not seem unreasonable to me. That's the intent. And also, if I could,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sure.

SENATOR BROMM: ...going to that same section and Senator Beutler's questions, Statute 60-1434, 1434 defines good cause and would have a bearing on this language, helps explain that language. And I've got it here, Senator Beutler, if you'd like to see it, or Senator Chambers. So the answer to your question though is I think that's probably an improvement, those words.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. I'm going to prepare that. So what I would like...Mr. President, are any other lights on at this time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: There are no lights on, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: There are now, Senator Bromm's light is on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, thank you.
