SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Thompson, just a question so that I can understand...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Thompson, will you respond?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...what you're doing here.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: You indicated in your remarks that this was designed for children from...preschool children.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The actual language says children from birth to age 21. Is that...is covering children to age 21, limited by some definition of their being students?
