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anything you'd have to say on that part I'd be interested in.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein, and you're correct in that we have had, over the years, problems with the schools, the Indian schools, because of the low property valuation and being able to generate enough revenue because of that, and so you're correct that this technicality in changing and recognizing they were having a unique problem with a lop-off was a technicality. But, as you pointed out, it does have a ramification and that's what I wanted to make sure that everyone would be aware of the fact that it does have that ramification of a million to a million and a half dollars.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And is that part of that equation that it...because they can do such little local effort apparently you've allowed federal aid, impact aid, to be counted or not counted? I'm not correct on it.

SENATOR BOHLKE: We cannot count the impact aid, but they can use the impact aid to shift and use for buildings. We cannot count the impact aid but still...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Oh, as other source...resources.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And so you made some wording change that actually brought this...made the technical change so that they could, which then impacted their ability to get more state aid.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right, it was in the committee amendments that we just adopted that made the technical change...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...and we weren't really aware until Sandy told our office that it would have this ramification.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, I was reading the A bill a little earlier on that and that's what I picked up out of the A bill
