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have in these different school districts that we discussed I think in my office here not very long ago, but the thing is now will this, if we do this, will that assist them, I know...in as far as can they use impact aid then to upgrade their buildings? And that's their biggest problem in the...in the...on the reservations as far as the public schools on reservation land, is finding the money. Well, actually they've got the...they've got the money but they can't get...they can't get anyone to finance them because of the...you can't use impact aid as far as guaranteeing the loan. So in this...this respect, this will help them in that situation, is that correct?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Senator Engel, what it will allow them to do is to shift more...to use that impact aid for their buildings. And if they were going to a bank and ever trying to convince a bank to give them the loan it would show an increase in state aid that could flow to the schools and the ability to use more...to use that impact aid for their buildings. And, you're right, it's not the amount that they're looking for, for what they need to repair their buildings, but it improves the situation.

SENATOR ENGEL: I know on the Winnebago Reservation the school there has certainly improved these last few years. They're doing a great job as far as student enrollment, doing a great job as far as running the school, and the thing is they are running out of room and they do need to expand, so I would commend that tribe for that, so...and hopefully it will pass over to the others.

SENATOR BOHLKE: This, like I said, this will help. It certainly won't solve the problem, but they do come out of this session with something positive to help them address that situation with their buildings.

SENATOR ENGEL: Thank you very much.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Engel. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Madam President and members of the body. Actually, Senator Engel just asked some of the questions that I was going to ask. As I mentioned to you in debate on another bill this year, I did have the chance to visit
