you should find the resolution passed by the commission that explains what they're doing and the uncompleted projects that they have at this time. For technical purposes, the amendment goes on to deal with the existing funding and this...this amendment does not include any new dollars. It merely changes the way the existing dollars will be spent over that amount of time. So, if you have any questions, I'd be happy to take those and, with that, I will conclude my opening. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: We have an amendment to the amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wickersham would move to amend the amendment. (AM2694, Legislative Journal page 944.)

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, members of the body, the amendment that I'm offering is to extend the life of the commission until January 1 of the year 2001, that is six months shorter than the period recommended to you by Senator Smith through the Landis amendment. The reason I am bringing the amendment to you, while this is not a committee amendment, this is the recommendation of the Revenue Committee. This is an issue that we discussed in committee a couple of weeks ago once we became aware that there was a desire of the commission to extend its life. That request or that desire arose apparently after the time for introduction of bills so there was no public hearing on the issue of whether or not the commission's life should be extended. It was the...but there was a discussion within the Revenue Committee. The tenor of that discussion was that the commission always knew that it was going to sunset; that that sunset was July 1st; that it should have been prudent management to bring along the commission's work so that the commission's work would have ended at approximately the same time as its sunset date, but if, for some reason, that had not occurred that the committee was willing to suggest to the rest of the Legislature a more modest extension of the life of the commission so that they could finish up their work. It is clearly not the recommendation of the Revenue Committee that the commission continue indefinitely. As you recall, the commission was created as a part of the recommendations by the Revenue Committee to the Legislature, one of...and one of them that was
