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think working hard and want to continue that. And they have made a commitment not to ask for a further extension, and so if they do not honor that commitment they certainly will not find my support down the road.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Smith, if this amendment is not adopted this commission continues to exist for how long?

SENATOR SMITH: Till July 1 of this year. Well, this amendment to the amendment, or the...or my amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What you're offering.

SENATOR SMITH: I'm offering an extension of twelve months. This amendment to the amendment offers six months and I will not oppose that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now let's get back to considering that neither your amendment nor Senator Wickersham's amendment to your amendment were to be adopted. What becomes of this commission and when?

SENATOR SMITH: It will terminate on July 1st of this year.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now can you show me one of these projects listed on here for which they were not able to get information during the past four years so that they have to continue in existence so they can spend now \$230,000 instead of \$130,000. And they got the \$230,000 because somebody found a hundred thousand they were entitled to that nobody knew about. What...which one of these projects involves such startlingly new and unobtainable information that this commission has to have its life...

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...extended beyond July of this year?

SENATOR SMITH: Senator Chambers, I can't really speak to that and the details that the commission has worked on. I guess I would suggest that I would much rather see a commission operate on a more limited amount of funds and come up with extra...and
