SENATOR JANSSEN: Time.

SENATOR TYSON: ...amendment as it relates to this subject, I rise in opposition to AM2674 and will probably do so again. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Hilgert, if I could, I just wanted to get the bill numbers from you again...

SENATOR HILGERT: Sure.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and some information so I could take a look at it this weekend maybe.

SENATOR HILGERT: Yeah, the concept of LB 1310, we heard the LB 1310 on February 7th, by the way, so it's not a new idea. It's been around for...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR HILGERT: ...awhile, so only an hour ago did...did any opposition rise. The second bill was LB 1311, which is, and to save you time, it's a 17-page bill that has a one-word change. On page 11, they strike the word "or", o-r.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR HILGERT: That's going to cost the state \$10.8 million if we don't do that. And then LB 1257 is the implementation of the Workforce Investment Act, LB 1257, I'll repeat the number, because, you know, JTPA expires in July the 1st.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Do...do any of these, Senator, require or will require at any time in the future at least under the present language any General Fund appropriations of any type?

SENATOR HILGERT: I believe the only General Fund appropriation is with LB 1257 which, let's see, do-do-do-do, no, which actually cuts expenditures. It...
