know of any recommendations it's made. I don't see significant school restructuring. It still moves at a snail's pace. I don't see any restructuring of significance with the counties and with other political subdivisions. So what this bill attempts to do actually is to create a situation that says state aid doesn't come second, state aid comes first. And it puts us in a position of a prejudice towards state aid, and this is important too, I think, not just a prejudice towards state aid, but a prejudice towards school state aid. Scenarios that may come in the future, maybe Senator Wickersham assumes that, if we have this, that sales and income tax will be forced up and everything will turn out all right. But another scenario is that this body may not...

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...agree to raise sales and income taxes. And if this bill is in place, then that money will have to come out of state aid to other political subdivisions, out of state aid to NRDs, to counties and other places. Or maybe it wouldn't come out of there. Maybe it would come out of the university, maybe it would come out of the State Patrol, maybe it would come out of a lot of those state functions that are very important to the operation of the state as a whole. Who knows in the future where it should come out of? Who can sit here today and say, yeah, I want to take it out of the university? I want to be sure local schools are all right to the extent that we set in this law and everything else be damned, it will come out of the university, it will come out of the State Patrol, that's the way it will...that's the way it's going to be. But how do you know what it's going to be? Maybe the federal government's kicked in a lot of money to...
