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area. I'd also like to point out that I think that there is a little bit of a misconception to think that all of the sales and income taxes come from the urban areas. I believe that we and Nebraska across the state, if you buy something, you do pay sales tax. I'm thinking last week, in Lincoln, we saw hundreds and thousands of people coming to Lincoln for tournament games, we see them coming to conventions. These cities have an additional city tax that they also gain some additional income. So I just wanted to make that point that I believe that this puts a little fairer burden. As Senator Kremer pointed out, we're talking about a cap of 46 percent on property, but also there would be a resulting cap on income and sales. So I believe that this is an attempt to make the system a bit fairer in the proportion of taxes paid. So I will be supporting Senator Wickersham's amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. (Doctor of the day introduced.) Senator Jensen, on the amendment.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the body, this was not a great weekend for me, number one. I was working on my taxes and then I'm thinking about the property taxes that the first half comes due the first of April. And I really...it really bothers me every time, at this time of year, and my wife will attest to that, that I get kind of grouchy, I guess, as I look at these dollars that we certainly do put out. But I have great concern with this bill. Now we have the opportunity here, we have LB 1107, the original bill, with 45, and then we have a 47, and now we have a 46 percent, so we kind of have a multiple choice here that...and we'll probably decide which is the best one for us. But I do have concern that I think we're tampering with and hurting our fiscal policy and removing a lot of the flexibility that we do have in financing our schools. I kind of look at this in one way as again, I think back, we have Initiative 300 on our ag ground, which tells us who we can sell to. It looks like this year we're going to pass an Initiative 300 for the automobile dealers, which also will protect them and see who they can sell to and who people have to buy from. And now we are having maybe Initiative 300 on our schools as to where they can get their dollars from. Now that might be a stretch, but still I think there's a correlation there that can be maintained. Last week, I did point out that
