the floor of the Legislature, about where to draw school district lines. I've never thought that this Legislature should or could get into that business. I can't imagine the kind of difficulties we would have doing that, and doing that with any kind of a reasonable objective in mind other than some purely parochial ones that would easily come to the surface in that kind of a battle. And I don't think it's something that the Legislature could ever, frankly, accomplish as to rejigger a bunch of school districts lines in the state of Nebraska. Can you imagine, can you imagine that kind of a process on this floor? That is something that is absolutely best left to the people who know the most about their schools, and those are the local elected school boards and the people that they represent. But there are some peculiarities about what Senator Beutler is bringing to you. He is saying that he wants the board of education to make recommendations that would maximize educational benefits. If you have ever examined the history of reorganizations and consolidations of schools, that has oftentimes been an objective in the reorganization and the consolidation of schools, and that's good, and that is very, very good. But guess what, folks? That does not save money. That does not save money. Now on the one hand Senator Beutler is suggesting to you that somehow this study and the implementation of the study would result in some sort of cost savings. That is not the history when folks undertake one of these efforts to maximize educational benefits. They always wind up spending more money, but they spend it, they wind up spending good money...more money for a good purpose. They do maximize educational benefits, but don't listen to the siren call that somehow this is going to save a bunch of money. That is, quite frankly, unlikely. And I, frankly, don't know how the State Board of Education could ever produce any kind of a result for us with the parameters that are in...that this would cause them to work under. Further, there seems to be some A bill version in the body today. I can't imagine how much this kind of a study would cost, and I don't think it's appropriate for us to set sail on something when we have no idea how much it would cost. We have not completely thought about the parameters that we might even set for the State Board of...State Department of Education to think about this issue, and I can't imagine this is something that we should do at this time.
