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going to have to try to fund that gap that the schools hadn't got, and we're saving that additional \$35 million to go to school aid. So that's where the \$100 million went over three years. There's an additional money, Senator Chambers, I think, and that's what I'm going to ask Senator Wehrbein, there's a popular notion that there's an additional property tax relief this year that goes to community colleges. Is that in this bill, Senator Wehrbein, or that's in a bill to come yet?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It's in a bill to come, LB 1217.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: That's...that second portion of the community college is not in this bill and I think that's the reason we're getting confused. There's two different years here. And so...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: (Microphone malfunction)...(inaudible) is made here.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...the transfer is made here and it's...and it's...right. And so what this is doing is saying, look, instead of transferring \$35 million for the second year of last year's property tax relief plan, you're only going to do 25 million dollars this year and that leaves 10 more million dollars available, is my understanding of that, and maybe that's oversimplified. But the real issue, Senator Wehrbein, is how much money is available for us to spend.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The real issue is how much is available for us to spend and how much you want for property tax relief.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: And that's what I hope we can try to frame today, and I know my time is going to run short, because it can be real confusing and I try to...I figure if I can understand it everybody else can. So I'm going to sit and listen and hopefully we can walk through that a little bit so people have their choices, because this really is all about choices at this point in time, and the bill, just so people know where the...where the...the extra community college money, which bill is that on our sheet coming?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: LB 1217 I think.
