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relief, which is a property tax credit if you recall.

SENATOR KREMER: I realize it is going to be the same dollars and all come from property tax, but the \$30 million to community colleges this year was not really in the plan last year. That was just an extension over what we did last year. Is that correct?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's true.

SENATOR KREMER: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Kremer. Senator Brashear, on on the committee amendment.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Wehrbein, it's been, what, four long years since I sat at your right hand attempting...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Six.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Six? No, but it's four since I left.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Oh. (Laugh)

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Since I sat at your right hand attempting to learn all of this.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. That's right.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: If you would engage in a little repartee with me, first of all, we can agree money is fungible, right?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: All right. And if it were, just hypothetically, if it were the will of the body to fully fund the \$35 million for the property tax relief then it isn't just a case of having...dropping \$10 million off of line 33 if we can find \$10 million someplace else. Isn't that true?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's true.
