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SENATOR BRASHEAR: And, at least theoretically, for example, we might, if we could find \$10 million in LB 1217, which is the deficit appropriation, we could have \$35 million of property tax relief that would fully fund that which the Governor was talking about, and we could have a full \$30 million which has always been in the radar screen, so to speak, or on the table for the community colleges, but we wouldn't have then that which the committee, in doing its good and conscience work, has determined ought to take place pursuant to LB 1217. Is that right?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: And this is simply...so in that sense it's simply a matter of allocation.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's true.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Is that true? Okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Janssen, on the committee amendments to LB 1214.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. Senator Wehrbein, I...I believe I understand what's happening here, but I want you to verify this. Last year there was \$35 million went to property tax relief for community colleges...or \$30 million.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, 30.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That was to...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right...it's right now, this year right now.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, but that's what we appropriated last year. Now, we had intended for that to be a one-year shot, is that right,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...just this year, out of that \$100 million?
