PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers, committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Beutler a question before...while his engine is still revved.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS. Senator Beutler, may I ask you a question?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Beutler, that credit would have shown up on a person's income tax form or whatever?

SENATOR BEUTLER: It would have shown up on his property tax statement.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Property, I'm sorry, yeah, property tax. Okay. But there was never a statement to any taxpayer of a specific dollar amount that that would be when it showed up, is that true?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, I don't think any citizen out there has any real idea of what that amount might be, if that's what you're asking. (inaudible).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if it didn't show up, if nothing showed up on that statement this year the average taxpayer probably would not even be aware that something was not happening that politicians had said would happen. Would you agree?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, we can only speculate on that, Senator, but there certainly would be a lot of people that wouldn't even notice.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the amount would have been roughly, if
