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you have any idea, on these tax statements of what?

SENATOR BEUTLER: The amount...the \$35 million, and, Senator Wehrbein, correct me if I'm wrong, but the \$35 million, as I understand it, would have been on the average about \$40...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...per...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, excuse me.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...per property tax payer...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and if you...and now we're reducing it to \$25 million so it will move down from about \$40 to about \$30. Is that roughly right? Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, Senator Beutler, without either you or I presuming to say how somebody would spend this great windfall, it's doubtful that with today's prices too much of anything could be obtained through the expenditure of that amount that they would get back. Is that true? I mean, it's not going to affect a family's budget that much, do you think?

SENATOR BEUTLER: It doesn't appear that it would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, on the other hand, it's a total of...is it \$35 million, oh, \$25 million if this bill goes through as is envisioned in its current form with the amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That \$25 million constitutes a sizeable chunk of change which could be put to use by the state if it chose to do so to accomplish some purpose that would be substantive in nature. Would you agree with that?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.
