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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Oh.

SENATOR BOHLKE: About the concern overall to the...to taxpayers being confused by extending this another year and then the reality hitting after.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, I said we really didn't discuss that in great detail, no, about what will happen the third year. No, we did not. Now I think...I don't want to take your time.

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, no, go ahead now.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Part of this came up, if you recall, and I...I...you never know how far to go without confusing the issue, but one of the reasons we're at \$30 million for the community colleges is that originally the TEEOSA aid was estimated it was going to be as high as 40. We ended up with an estimate of about \$34 million let's say the first of the year. Then, when we certified, it dropped to \$29 million. Twenty-nine and 30 are close and so it's kind of the reason we got it at \$30 million and it's an additional property tax relief and this way going to the colleges is because...is that less TEEOSA aid that we needed. And I want...there's a discussion on this on page 2 for those of you that like to read that.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And...and then, Senator Wehrbein, refresh my memory. Last year, when we were talking about \$30 million in property tax release...relief and I remember we talked about a typical home and I can't remember if we talked a typical home \$70,000 or \$100,000. Seemed to me we were talking somewhere in the neighborhood of 40-some dollars in property tax relief.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Do you remember?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: This is right out of that. It's in that discussion. On a \$100,000 valued home the reduction would reduce the credit from \$40 and...

SENATOR BOHLKE: So...
