consideration and it's primarily on page 11. We have some very serious things facing this state and if you take away the top four, which are enormous amount of money, I guess maybe it is proper to talk about it on this, they...they totaled \$76 million. We're up to about \$81 million. But, for example, I'm going to drop down to the mental health provider rates. All of those are additional spending that we've done in the last six weeks, if you will. We have very serious problems with our mental health provider rates. They have not been changed for six years. The water lawsuit with Kansas v. Wyoming and Kansas versus...or Nebraska v. Wyoming, Kansas v. Nebraska, if you notice, that's nearly \$2 million additional. Sheldon Memorial Art Gallery renovations, that's for heating and air conditioning and that is world class art but we are giving the risk of having serious damage to our art because of heating/air conditioning failing. It's 40 years old. It's a very similar situation the State Historical Society, their heating and air conditioning. We have CHARTS. We'll...that's going to be a whole other issue, but our CHARTS with our child support adminis...we are...it's going to cost us a million six additional money this year. Region VI has serious problems with mental health services. We put additional money in there. We added some money for minority scholarship, we added money for Nebraska Information System, that's our accounting system with DAS, and it goes on and on. So we made the calculated decision to spend an additional \$10 million and it had to come from somewhere. That's where it came from. But those are the issues that are all subject to debate as to where that money should or should not be spent versus property tax relief. And so some of it has to do, I believe, with...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...the philosophy who has responsibility for the state versus property taxes. We have some additional bills here on the floor that are going to have property tax relief, clerk of the district courts and so forth, additional money for special education. That's \$2.6 million. We do have \$1.4 million in for the bill on the school testing, but all those are the issues that we had to discuss and see how we were to fit in, so that basically is our decision to take really only \$10 million from that, realizing that we're going to be building
