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SENATOR CHAMBERS: But she sees something else. When the man says the same words, he's talking about something other than money. But the idea behind all of those kind of lyrics is that there are different ways people have of communicating what they intend to get across and you cannot always count on the words that proceed from a person's mouth as being an accurate indication of what is in their mind, and it certainly doesn't go to motivation. But I'm going to have to offer an amendment so that I'll have the opportunity to engage in further discussion. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Crosby, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I'm not going to talk about the technical side of the transfers or the property tax relief or the community college. I'm going to talk about the human element. And I am pleased that Senator Wehrbein went through some of the things that the Appropriations Committee has worked very hard on, some bills that were introduced that...and some adjustments that needed to be made. One of the things we have to remember about the budget is that it represents state government and we have to run state government. We offer services to the constituency that if you start nitpicking at any of the programs, you've come up against that in your other committees, there is a constituency out there that needs the services that we offer through Health and Human Services, through Department of Motor Vehicles, which is almost a cash agency and so on. But I'm going to talk about some of you have said things like, well, \$30 or \$40 doesn't mean much to the average individual. Yes, it does. It does to people in my district, and property tax relief is what I hear more than any other issue. Now, that's probably because in Lincoln and especially perhaps in certain areas most people own their own homes and that's an American dream that has started in the twenties and thirties to own your own home. And, yes, you usually own it with the bank, but the lending agencies do, when there is a reduction in taxes, even that...that payment that you make that includes something for the escrow so the lending agency can pay the real estate taxes when the time comes, they reduce those. And don't tell me they don't because I have had
