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that happen to my escrow. At the moment, I pay my own real estate taxes so I don't have to be concerned about that. But you take a young couple. I have people in my district that make anywhere from \$25,000 a year and up to many, many times that, but each one of them has a goal. They...you know that for a man and a woman to take two or three kids out to McDonald's costs \$25 or \$30 very easily, so don't tell me that \$25 or \$30 doesn't mean a lot to them. It does. And if they get a little rebate on their real estate taxes if they're pay...some people do pay them themselves just as I do, if they get a little rebate they notice that, because most of us do look at the bill and what the...what each levy is, how much the school levy is. The school levy takes most of the bill. It does in my school district. So my only point in...in...when we talk about real estate taxes, just remember property taxes, as a whole, are paid by individuals, individuals who own their own homes. And I know that the ag valuations and so on are different from that. And, yes, the valuation goes up and then the little...the little help that we gave sometimes goes away. My real estate taxes went down a couple of years ago, not a whole lot, but because we finished paying for a county project that had been...that we'd been levying a little bit each year for. So...once in while the school levy goes down, not very often, but under the lid it doesn't really go up. So, as I said at the beginning, I'm talking about the human element. And I have some things in that budget that I want and I want them to remain constant...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...but then the last remark I want to make is Senator Brashear has talked about that \$10 million. Well, what...I just want to make...I want to say this because it doesn't seem like this has come through. I think there were three or four million dollars in the budget originally for A bills, bills that are here on the floor that you have introduced and that you have an A bill. They...we added \$10 million for those A bills, so be careful if you have an A bill hanging around that you want. So all I'm...but I'm saying what that \$10 million is available to spend. There is no law or rule that we have to spend it. So thank you very much.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Mr. Clerk,
