Wehrbein another question if I may.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, halfway down the page, about, is a Health and Human Services amount for a so-called Wilderness Camp.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you see that?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is it true that that's a place where they're going to be raising turkeys for hunting?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, Senator Chambers, it is not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. That's something that's got to go and I think we may as well make...oh, the final question. Senator Wehrbein, this amendment that I'm offering here is not one that I'm going to take to a vote necessarily, but to give a chance to discuss. If a person desires to make a change in some of these expenditures the first thing that's going to be changed in the bill before us is dropping that amount from \$35,000 (sic) to \$25,000 (sic) that goes into this tax relief fund.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Million, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If that is done in this bill and, subsequent to our consideration of this bill, changes are made in LB 1217, we might have to come back and reamend this bill.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, you wouldn't have to, but you certainly could.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Depending on where we decide the money would come from.
