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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. This is only for the first two blocks,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...that's starting to get to be a short-term...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...by the way.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Right. And, I guess, my issue is, if we're going to do it, shouldn't we have control over doing it and just take over the whole area? But I understand that may not be possible to do. The other issue is in the area of child support and CHARTS. On the handout here that you have we're talking about \$1.6 million for the two year total. This would be down in the Health and Human Services area. But actually we're facing a \$3.6 million fine, I believe, aren't we?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's next year?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: That's...that's not...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's to come.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: That's to come, and that's a huge issue that we are going to have a child support bill, hopefully we get to this year. But somebody has got to be responsible. That program was supposed to have been done in 1998, it's now the year 2000. Obviously, it's not going to get done this year, it's not going to get done next year. And I doubt if it's going to get done the next year after that. And I would really hope that somebody seriously looks at this. If we're going to continue to get penalized like that, that's a huge sum of money that could solve a lot of other problems around here, rather than paying penalties for us being out of compliance. And my guess is somebody has no idea what they're doing in that system. And I'd be real interested to hear also the committee's attitude towards the child support penalties in those areas. In fact, I've got a little bit of time, Senator Wehrbein, if you want to take it,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right.
