Kristensen, it probably won't be up a year from now either. Supposed to be up September 30, 2000; they postponed that to September 30, 2001, hence the sanctions times two, \$7 million. On top of this, somebody has to be held accountable over there. And I have an amendment being drawn up, printed, dealing with that, it, of course, addresses the bill, not the committee amendments. But to bring people further up to date, IBM has been contacted, I think they're actually over there working on it now, trying to make some sense out of this CHARTS, N-FOCUS, JUSTICE, the whole ball of wax over there. It's obviously not working after...if my totals are right, there's been \$115 million put in through N-FOCUS, CWIS, Child Welfare Information System, CHARTS and JUSTICE, \$115.8 million, a third of it, roughly, is state money. And my bet, as I said before, is that it's not going to be up and going a year from now either, hence more sanctions. It's not the problem of the Legislature. We addressed that with the State Disbursement Unit and the State Treasurer's Office was ready to go and get this thing rolling. It's now all on hold until IBM comes up with something. And as I understand, it's supposed to have...they're supposed to have a report to us by April 1st, before we adjourn, so that we can take a look at this. My bet would be they're going to say we need to start or back up and do something, you know, revamp the whole system, just my guess. But the way things have worked up to here, that wouldn't surprise me in the least. So I do have an amendment being drawn up on that, and I will introduce it at a later time. With that, I yield the rest of my time back to the Chair. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Don Pederson.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body, if we've already spent \$54 million on a program, called CHARTS, that doesn't work, and we see that we're going to be penalized again for it continuing not to work, I think we're not getting our money's worth. And I think it's an administrative problem to try and resolve this. But there's certainly nothing we can do here. It's in the administration that has to resolve this matter. And we're very concerned about it. I know, as somebody said, are we skeptical, yes, we're very skeptical. We became even more skeptical when we got the letter from the
