PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Chambers, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, the debacle, not just deficits that we're facing from CHARTS. I told you all earlier you are dealing with an administration in chaos, in disarray. Suppose the Legislature had conducted our affairs in this slipshod, inexcusably, careless, negligent, wreckless, incompetent manner? They'd be saying, that's why they don't deserve a raise, in fact they ought to all be run right out of there. You know that, but it's the administration; so three million here, three million there, here a three, there a three, everywhere a three three, and nobody cares that much, except us. And ultimately, guess who's going to be blamed in the minds of the public, if they ever become aware of that incompetency and these fines or sanctions, however they are characterized? The Legislature. Oh you are going to get kicked around by your Governor now, and I'm just going to laugh, laugh, laugh, because we "gettin'" down to you all's business now and some of your bills. Senator Brown, in answering Senator Suttle's questions about these computers and what might be required to be done, and she said it's not a hardware problem, it's a software problem. I'd say it's a soft head problem. And, remember, we're dealing with the geniuses, we're dealing with the experts. They were given money, they were given time. But since the "Repelicans" are in charge, they can do whatever they want to and people soft-shoe around them. I'm enjoying this. My good friend, Senator Don Pederson, talked about the Wilderness Camp. You know the problem that I see with all of these types of activities? A Wilderness Camp, a boondoggle out in Broken "Bone", so that the Governor can make some political hay out there, we have a juvenile system which is developing itches, an itch here, and an itch there. Instead of giving the entire system a bath or a sheep dip, you all want to build another arm or finger to scratch with. And not one of these alternatives is going to solve the problem, not one. This Wilderness Camp will go out there in an area where the Governor is going to need to campaign. We don't know when this thing is going to be operational, but it's going to be \$3,175,000 minimum on top of that boondoggle out in Broken "Bone", and that's going
