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and so the proposal that will be in front of us when we take up the bill that makes...puts in place some of the...the specificity of the single Disbursement Unit includes many of the recommendations that were on the floor last year and some of the recommendations that came from the study this summer in terms of how we deliver good, quality customer service. I do believe that we have a solution. The solution is the single Disbursement Unit. Unfortunately, our computer abilities are not supporting that solution at this time and there is no excuse for it and it needs to be fixed. But in terms of our process, in terms of what we need to be concerned about in the future for computer systems versus the shortcomings of administering those programs, I think we do have before us, in the work of the NITC, some hope for the future that we will not be getting into these messes. But I would just ask you once again to try to keep separate the issue of the SDU from the computer system, because there are some ways that we can look at hopefully fixing the computer aspect of it and I think that there are some ways that we can avoid this kind of situation in the future. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Bohlke, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members, I was just doing a review with Senator Jensen and asking him at what time they were told that we, indeed, would be sanctioned or have a fine and certainly, as I understand it, it was his under...he was just recently, within the last month, was that accurate enough, Senator Wehrbein? Last two months? Two weeks. And so I hear Senator Brown saying that we always knew or we have known that we have a computer system that's out of compliance so that that wasn't the problem. Well, if that wasn't the problem then we've spent all the time redesigning a new system of compliance knowing it's...we have an out-of-compliance computer system, that we were going to put the new program into the out-of-compliance computer system, and I can't figure out whoever would have thought that that was going to work. It just doesn't make sense. And I'm...I have great empathy for the Appropriations Committee and probably, if I remember right, I think I remember a private company that we, the state, contracted with to come in and figure out our computer system and make sure that we...the amount of money we were spending had
