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a computer system that was ready to take us into the next century. I believe that that hasn't happened. My concern now is that we have never corrected the root of the problem and I don't know if IBM is going to be able. I have...probably have a great idea what their suggestion is going to be. You know, I'm sure it will be no novel thought as to what they think we should do. But we still come back to knowing all along that we had this computer system out of compliance and continuing to design a program for a computer system that was out of compliance and telling those of us who wanted to change the program going into the out-of-compliance computer system that we shouldn't do that because if we did that we were going to cause the state to be fined, and here we are. Now, Senator Brown, do you remember? If you would yield, please?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Some...sometimes from year to year we...it's difficult to remember certain discussions, but this one I remember and I remember we talked last year, and you're right, it was about the customer service piece, A; it was about the disbursement piece, B; and I'm not sure if we ever had a discussion as to if our computers were in compliance. But when we were having that discussion, we were never told that we knew that our computers were not in compliance.

SENATOR BROWN: Yes. Yes, we did because...

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, not when...not on the floor last year...

SENATOR BROWN: Oh, yeah. Oh, yes, because...because...

SENATOR BOHLKE: If I could ask anyone here to raise their hand during that discussion and say we know that we...

SENATOR BROWN: Because we dealt with it, we dealt with it statutorily. We added a provision to the bill that was adopted to bring Douglas County onto the system because that was the piece that we thought was the problem, was getting Douglas Coun...
