PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...just a lot of venting. I am hoping that with the kind of disclosures that have taken place we will now undertake the very serious and painstaking work of building a budget that embodies meaningful policy decisions. The Governor is doing what he thinks is in his best interests as a politician. We must do what we think is in the best interest of the state. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAUFSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Kristensen, on the committee amendments.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I don't think, since any...since no one has put out an amendment to deal with child support, that we're probably going to gain any progress in this issue at this point in time. But I'm passing out a letter that I sent last week over to Health and Human Services and I think we need to begin to develop some plan of how we're going to address this. Senator Brown has talked till she's blue in the face trying to find answers; most of us have. There's a bill coming up, I think it's Senator Jensen's priority bill, dealing with the SDU. Sometime before this session is over, at least in child support, we need to have some specific answers in a form that we can begin to monitor, and it's obvious that I don't think it's going to work if we just turn it over and say do the best you can. I think we need to have some accounting; we need to find out who's in charge and who's responsible for it. There's a bill coming along that would set up a task force that...in statute, that would continue and they wouldn't just be a sounding board. They're going to try to monitor this while the Legislature is not in session. We need to look seriously at doing that. I think there's a variety of other things that are out there but, quite frankly, my guess is it's seriously underfunded and there's been overexpectations, and that people have said we're going to do in the future, we can get this done.
