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PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I would like to withdraw that pending amendment and substitute the one that is up there. So the first thing, I'd like to withdraw the pending amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Without objection, it is withdrawn. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would now like to substitute this amendment which is up there, and what it would do, thanks to the sharp eye of my mentor, Senator Dierks, who is also the chairperson of the Ag Committee of which I'm a member, there are two places in this committee amendment that relate to the Microenterprise Program and the 50 percent phraseology appears in two locations. The one is where I had mentioned...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Let's address your substitution before you open on the amendment, if we could. Without objection, the amendment is substituted. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Just keep in mind what I said prior. The original amendment would have gone to page 7, line 27 where you see fifty percent. Strike that fifty percent and insert twenty-five percent. Then on page 8 in line 17 is fifty percent again. That would be stricken and twenty-five percent would be inserted. If you're looking at the amendment as it appears in the bill book, the committee amendment, that is, it would be on page 4 of that amendment as it appears in the bill book, and that will help you locate it. If you have any questions, I will answer them. And while I'm on my feet, I will say this about the bill. I'm going to listen to what the other amendments are, see what direction the discussion takes, but a policy decision is being made with this bill. Let's say that the amount were dropped to \$100,000, there would be a policy decision but the
