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organizations can inform, educate, share new methods with their membership, the kinds of things that we see on the Wehrbein handout here. Disseminating that information can be achieved without actually any investment of extra dollars. And so that's my question for Senator Dierks, would it be possible for them to actually receive a grant without any actual monetary investment?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Dierks, would you yield?

SENATOR DIERKS: This would...this particular legislation requires in-kind funds, I think. I'd rather that you ask Senator Wehrbein, I think he has a better grasp of that than I have, but I think that's the way it's intended.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you. Senator Wehrbein.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield to a question from Senator Redfield?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator Wehrbein, I was asking if with the passage of the Chambers amendment and the committee amendments, if, in fact, the contribution, the matching contribution could be achieved without any cash investment at all, that it could just be in-kind donation of space, or actual newsletters that are already being printed for the dissemination of the educational materials.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I, Senator Redfield, I think that's true of the Microenterprise, it's patterned along the Microenterprise, and I...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...am not intimately familiar with that, but I think it would qualify in...whatever the present guidelines are would be the same, and I think they are. I'll look, I'll check that.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you. Did you say time, sir?
