PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: About forty-five seconds.

SENATOR REDFIELD: I have one other question and it also involves your handout, Senator Wehrbein, where you give us some examples of Jim Jenkins (phonetic) and also some poultry producers who have organized and they've found a value-added industry that they are actually involved in, and I don't see that they got any help from the state and yet they were able to achieve these means without a grant program. I am going to listen very carefully but I'm very hesitant about grant programs. I'd like to see investments that show us we actually have a business, not just an organization, spending money and disseminating it. If you'd like to address that, Senator Wehrbein, I might have a few seconds.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time. Senator Connealy, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR CONNEALY: I, too, rise in support of the Chambers amendment. I think it allows more flexibility. Speaking to the committee amendment, this does pare back the original bill dramatically, makes it more palatable here. We're talking about \$1 million for this project and just \$525,000 increase for the Microenterprise part. The Microenterprise would be able to go statewide with this amount of money. It's a real active successful program and I think with this money that we'll be able to even have more success. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Connealy. Senator Chambers, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I listened very carefully to what Senator Wehrbein said. I had suggested earlier that I am weakening in my opposition, and when he mentioned the huge amounts that 775 are giving back to these big businesses that don't even need the money, then there's a bill to extend one of those giveaway programs for the big companies another year, and just a few months ago one of them left Omaha and took a lot of jobs. Senator Wehrbein, I don't know if you were really thinking this thing through but you hit me where I live with that last presentation you made. Fair is fair. This bill is one that I'm going to support. There are
