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in effect, I think there should be a sunset. Basically, I would follow on his remarks with regard to why I believe there should be a sunset. This is the second bill we've had this session which historically I don't remember seeing before. But it is an effort to re...to respond to a low point in a particular sector of an economy, and usually we don't get into the business of trying to involve ourselves in the economy to do this sort of thing, but earlier this year, as you will recall, we just advanced a bill to give 800, essentially, about \$800,000 to ten wealthy companies who are broadcasters for the purpose of getting them over a little short hump. So it makes eminent sense to me that we're giving just a little more money to help a whole lot more people to get over a lot larger hump. So I can't complain about that at all. But I do think that that general idea is one we should be very cautious about, and if we're doing it as a one-time shot, as Senator Wehrbein described, to help a particular industry, then we ought to look at it critically every so often to see if the critical conditions which were the cause of us passing the bill continue to persist. Otherwise, we'll be in the process of having a bill like that for every industry that has a little downcycle at this point in time or at some other point in time. So that...that trend bothers me a little, and also the trend of identifying a particular industry, of identifying a particular industry. I think if you looked at almost all of our other economic development programs, they don't identify a particular industry. They identify a certain set of conditions that we wish to attain. They identify a certain kind of activity, like training, for example, but they tend to apply it to all different kinds of industry. This bill is a little different in the sense that it directs itself towards one industry, albeit our most important industry, but I think we ought to be conscious of that tendency, and for that reason, for those philosophic reasons, I guess, I am suggesting that there be a sunset on the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Wehrbein, on the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President and members, I would support the sunset provision. It was my intent to, as I've said earlier, to be a jump-start. This...I would in...thinking here perhaps for legislative intent that as we appropriate this money
