There have been all kind of little hints here and there to let you know this is what I'm working my way up to. I'm going to make a motion to pull this out, so I'm going to support pulling another bill out earlier, trying to do things like I do them. I'm somewhat disappointed, but I am ready to go to the mat, I'm ready to take my whippings that you all are going to put on me; but I assure you, I intend to fight back. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There are no further lights on. Senator Dierks, Chairman of the Ag Committee, did you wish to close on your committee amendment?

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, I think that we've had quite an interesting discussion this morning.
