CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Committee amendments are adopted. We are now discussing the advancement of LB 1348 to E & R Initial. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, lest it be forgotten, in case anybody is interested in being reminded, I'm going to support this bill. But there are other bills of similar import that I'm not going to support. Senator Wehrbein made a good case for this particular bill, but I still don't think a good policy is embodied in what the bill does. But so much has been done going in another direction that this little bit here is not going to be outrageous, so I'm going to support it. But I see another bill coming up shortly thereafter which (laugh) I'm not going to support, and I will not give the number of the bill, I will not give the name of the introducer but, if you count down the alphabet about four places from the end of the alphabet, you might get a hint. This bill gets my vote, though, for advancement.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There are no further lights on. Senator Wehrbein, did you wish to close on LB 1348?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members, we've had an intensive discussion of this bill, I believe, this morning. And I'm not going to say anymore, I just urge its advancement. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. The question before the body is, shall LB 1348 advance to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 40 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 1348.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 1348 does advance to E & R Initial. Mr. Clerk, next agenda item.
