does not change this year's budget. Currently in this year's budget, as was completed last year in our budget discussions, \$2.2 million were added to the budget this year for purposes of renovation or replacement of buildings at Kearney or Geneva. The budget, as proposed, would have required an amendment to the law to change that money to be used for a parole revocation facility. That was the proposal of the administration. The Appropriations Committee did not choose to divert that money; instead have put \$50,000 into the budget for planning for the parole revocation facility. That leaves the original \$2.2 million currently unallocated for a specific building project. If you recall last year's debate, at which time we paid...or put money in the budget for the development of a Facility Master Plan, which was completed, which is this document that many of you have seen in your committees or in your work, that was released in...at the first of the year, there are recommended projects for your...the beginning phase of rebuilding and building new facilities at the two YRTCs. Recommended for this year is a multipurpose building at Geneva, and that outline of what that would be is on the yellow sheet. So what this amendment would do would be to allocate the \$2.2 million for a specific building so that they could begin this year on this project. It will have an A bill that will allocate additional funds for next year of over \$900,000, so that they can bid it, \$970,848, which will be in next year's budget, so they can start building this building and not have to wait a year to begin the process of going out for bid and building the multipurpose building. So that's essentially what it does, what this amendment does. Again, it does not add money to this year's budget, but it does make a commitment in next year's budget for the remainder of the money that is needed for the multipurpose facility at Geneva. I will go over now some of the reasons why this is such an important facility, why we shouldn't wait, why we need to make this commitment so that this process can begin. As you know, both facilities are overcrowded. The length of stay is short at both facilities. But in addition to those types of issues, there are problems in terms of management, there are problems in terms of the services that need to be provided, and I know other people will probably be wishing to make comment to that...some of those specific facilities. But this multipurpose facility will add ten beds of Level V, that's high security and special...for special needs,
