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mental health problems we have, many of the juvenile delinquency problems we have goes back to drugs and alcohol. And if and when we ever solve that dilemma, I think we'll solve all sorts of societal problems. But until we get there, we're going to have to keep doing these kinds of things at the state of Nebraska level. This is part of that.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: If there's better answers, we need to be looking at them. And obviously we've had several studies over the last few years, trying to do things. We're doing community health or community justice space programs. I'm not sure how much is in that, but I think close to \$5 million, community-based juvenile programs. Do you...is that...that's completely new money from when we started four or five years ago. We have lots of money going into drug and alcohol programs, and still we are told that that's not enough. So this is part of that bigger problem and I think we just have to recognize it and work to continue to do some things to solve that. But until that time comes, our facilities are overcrowded, they're inadequate and they don't provide the adequate care that these juveniles need in many cases. So I am supporting this additional amendment too...it's in the future. We will affirm it next year, but it is a fact of life.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. (Visitors introduced.) Debate on AM2852, Senator Suttle, followed by Senators Redfield, Jensen, and Dwite Pedersen. Senator Suttle.

SENATOR SUTTLE: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I rise in support of allocating this money and/or reaffirming our intent to put this money towards this facility in Geneva. I don't know whether...I know that many of you have visited the...the facility in Geneva. One of the places that this building will look at is the medical area. It's essentially right now in Geneva where the kids have to go when they're brought in or when they're sick. When they are being examined, they go to a room that's about the size of a closet and that's all there is for the medical treatment at Geneva. In this new multipurpose building, we will have adequate facilities
