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maintenance. What I've looked at, in some of the previous requests from the department those were not funded. But I will get the fire information to you as soon as I have time to look for it in my plan. We need to look at all the buildings that exist on the campuses. Next year, clearly, in my view...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, on the Thompson amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, if the body and the Governor, I don't know what his position is on this, but if the body were serious, we have a model for building correctional facilities. A huge amount, in my opinion, was expended for the male prison, one fell swoop. We're going to pitch and patch here, a little bit here, begging, crying, hoping that money that was promised at one point will not be diverted to some other purpose. And then there's so much talking about concern for the young people and the children. I don't buy it. The Appropriations Committee fought hard last...two years ago, whenever it was, to get all the money for the male prison, and others did. I don't see that here. I know Ben Nelson wanted to be sure and get the prisons. He still didn't win the govern...I meant the Senate. When he threw together the HHS, which now is a monstrosity, and I fought against it, that didn't help him win the Senate. He wanted to show that he was consolidating government. Now you got a sprawling monstrosity over there that nobody can make head or tail of, and if you try to get an answer to a question, you have trouble finding somebody who can refer you to somebody who might give you an answer. So when those political decisions are taken, the rest of us who are serious are left trying to pick up pieces and add a little bit of a Band-Aid here on a very serious problem, and that's all that Senator Thompson's efforts are doing. That's the approach she is compelled to take. There is no will in the Legislature to address the problems of these young people, and that's why we're going to have to battle on that Wilderness Camp thing--another little bitty piece over there. And I have yet to see, maybe I've forgotten it, another situation where the state is going to
