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that...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I don't want to use your time. I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, go ahead.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...I'll give a little history of it when...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Go ahead.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The way we understand it, it was first brought to our attention in our agency hearing, which would be, let's say, early February, but it had originated two or three years ago, we understand, within the previous Health administration, Health and Human Service administration, and apparently approximately last June a year ago was reinvigorated and had some requests for proposals to move forward with some alternatives to incarceration at Kearney. So it's been...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...in the works awhile and I would say has been revived (inaudible).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, was there any overlap between this notion and that boot camp that was put into operation?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, the boot camp, that work ethic camp, if I may use the correct term, is not operational yet. It's getting close. I will say the first we knew of the Wilderness Camp-type proposal was approximately the first part of February.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it may not have been brought up in the past because that boot camp looked like it was going to go forward. Is that a possibility?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, obviously that was...occurred
