SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Thank you, Senator Pederson. We are discussing the Chambers amendment, AM2819, to LB 1217. Those wishing to speak are Senator Chambers, Bromm, Jensen, Wehrbein, Senator Dwite Pedersen, Senator Preister. Senator Chambers, on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Don Pederson a question or two.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Pederson?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I know that one of the locations that was being considered was in Fullerton area.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How far is that from Lincoln or Omaha, because...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: It's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I have no concept?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: ...well, it's...I think it's not too terribly far from Columbus. I don't have a map with me, Senator Chambers, so I'm not sure.
