SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many lawsuits have been brought against them?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I would have no way of knowing.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So are they going to sell it like any other product is sold, by giving you the best possible slant on everything?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Well, Senator Chambers, I would imagine that it's like any other product. If you are selling a product and misrepresenting that product, you're not going to get a next buyer, are you, and so I think that's what we have in this situation. If they have misrepresented themselves to us, number one, we can get out of this contract in one year.
