SENATOR CHAMBERS: But let me ask you this, because this is my last time to speak...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...on this. How many others did they give you to check with to see how well they had done? Did they give you a list of other states where they had had successful programs and said, check with these people and see what we've done?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: We have a list of places where they have facilities in Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Montana, Oklahoma.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, that's just a state. Did they give you names of any officials in those states to check with?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: It's the Brown School at Cedar Springs in Colorado Springs.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, no, you're just talking to Honda's headquarters and Honda's franchisees. Did they give you the name of the Motor Vehicle Licensing Board to ask how well Honda has been doing? In other words, did they give you the name of the individual with whom they had signed the contract in those states, the agency that they had signed with?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I think if we had wanted to go and talk to each one of these people we would know who they contracted with and for what purpose.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Pederson. Members of the Legislature, this should have been a bill. If HHS had sent out requests for proposals as much as two years ago, can you understand why they had no Plan B? They don't intend to address the problem as a whole. For two years they have not even considered doing anything to address the problem in a substantive way. This is all that they've had in mind. And one outfit comes here and
